Starting Knots

Fold Over Knot

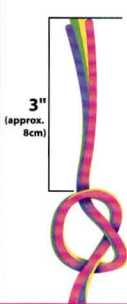
Fold the strings in half and tie into a $\frac{1}{2}$ " (approx. 1cm) loop.



Shown here:
Fold 4 strings in half.
You now have 8 strings.

Basic Knot

Tie a basic knot with all strings 3" (approx. 8cm) from end.



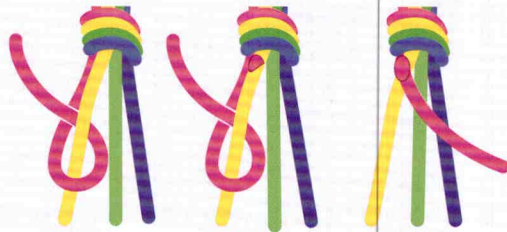
The 2 Basic Knots You Must Learn

Forward Double Knot

Left string over then under the right string.

REPEAT

Always tie 2 knots before moving on to the next string.



Backward Double Knot

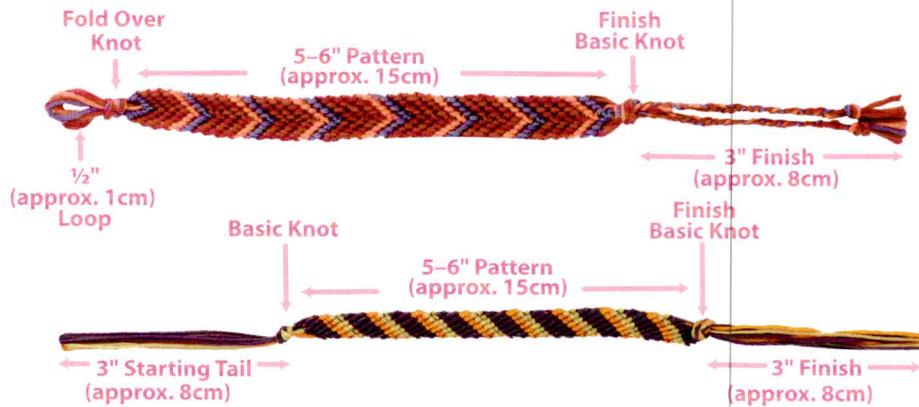
Right string over then under the left string.

REPEAT

Always tie 2 knots before moving on to the next string.

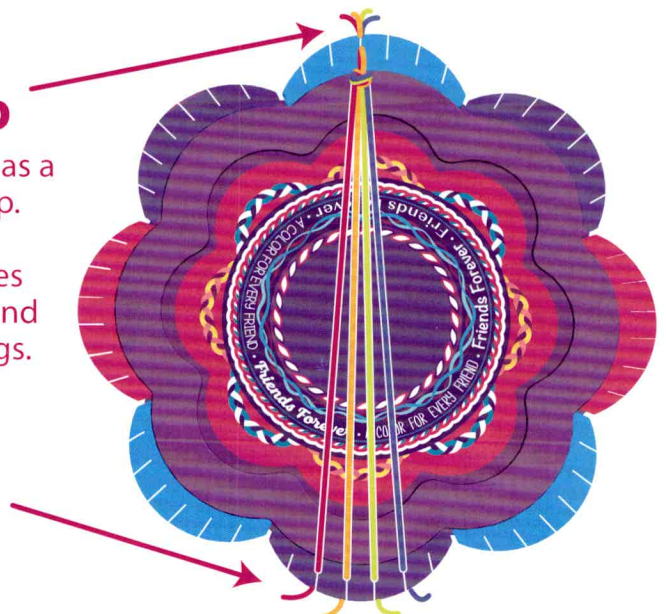

Classic: Diagonal

A sweet easy favorite. It's all FORWARD DOUBLE KNOTS! 🌟

You will need:

4 strings 36"
(approx. 91cm) each

Starting knot:

Basic knot



For a thicker bracelet double the strings

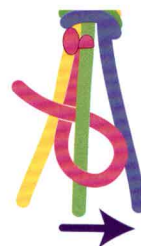

1 Forward double knot the string on left onto the string to the right. Pull tight.



2 Continue making forward double knots with the same string onto the rest of the strings.

Classic: Chevron

The crazy classy classic. 🌟🌟

You will need:

6 strings 72"
(approx. 183cm) each

Starting knot:

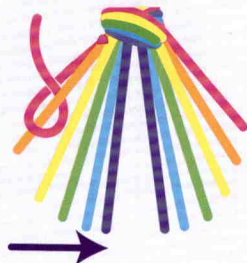
Fold over knot.
You now have 12 strings.



Set up



1 Forward double knot the left string onto each of the strings in the left section. **Stop.**



2 Backward double knot the right string onto each of the strings in the right section. **Stop.**



3 Tie a knot TWICE with the 2 middle strings (the same strings you just knotted with). The left string will now be with the right section. The right string will now be with the left section.



Wave

Just like its name, create a pretty wave. It's impressive AND easy! 🌟🌟🌟

You will need:

4 strings 40" (approx. 102cm) (Holding Strings*)
3 strings 70" (approx. 178cm) (Working Strings)

*You will not see the holding strings in your finished bracelet.

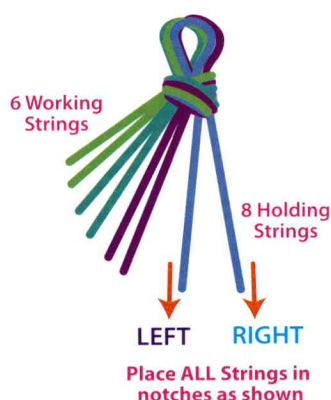

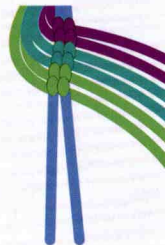
1 Forward double knot the inside working string on the left, onto both holding string groups. Move left to right.



2 Forward double knot the next inside string onto both holding groups. Move left to right.



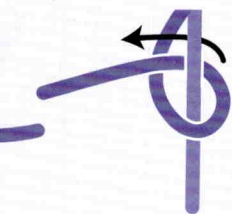
3 REPEAT knotting the on the left. When done bracelet will look like



THINGS TO KNOW

- Only knot with the working strings. The holding string groups stay in place.
- Forward knot all the strings on the left until they are all on the right.
- Backward knot all the strings on the right, until they are all on the left.

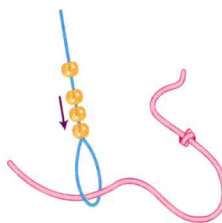

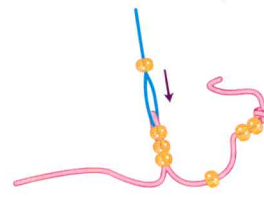
Add Beads

Here's how to use the threader.

1 Put beads onto the end
of the threader until
they stop at the loop.



2 Push the beads over the loop
onto the string making sure
the string tail doesn't come
out of the threader loop.

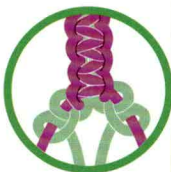
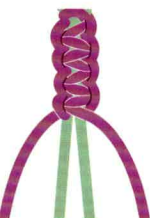


Make 2 Larks Head Knots

Secure the long cords
in the notches.

a. Tie the short left
cord to the left
long cord like this.

b. Tie the short right
cord to the right
long cord like this.



Your bracelet should
look like this with both
short cords facing in.

3 REPEAT STEPS 1 & 2
Make 4 Square Knots.
Make 2 Larks Head Knots.

Repeat until the bracelet is
as long as you want.

2 ADD BEADS onto the short 2 center cords.
Then, secure the 2 center cords in the notches.



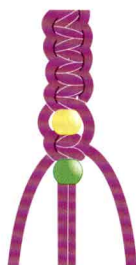

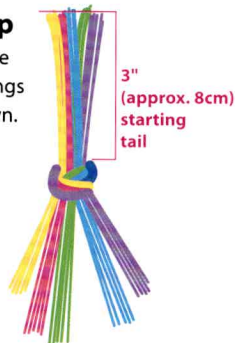
Works best with several strings per grouping.



You will need:
5 colours-5 strings
each (total 25
strings) - 30"
(approx. 76cm) each

Starting knot:

HOW TO ADD LETTER BEADS

DIAGONAL

To make the XOXO bracelet,
make a 6 strand bracelet.

Knot for about
12 rows to make
sure your beads
will be centered
in your bracelet.

Continue
knotting.

Then, string the
beads through
ALL the strings.

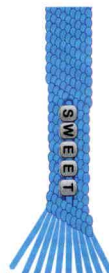
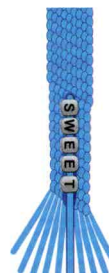
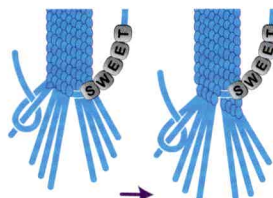
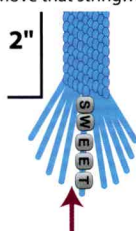


To make a wide diagonal bracelet with beads, make a 10 strand bracelet.
Knot 2" (approx. 5cm) before adding beads.

Knot 5 strings, then
add beads to your
working string.
Move that string...

...and repeat steps 2, 3, & 4
with the string on the left,
knotting the 8 strings.

When you've knotted the length of the
letter beads (approx 8 rows), add the
center string back as the 6th string and
continue knotting.



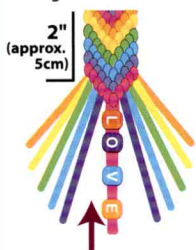
CHEVRON

Knot 2" (approx. 5cm) before adding beads.

Add beads to the 2 center
strings and move those
strings aside...

...and repeat step 2, 3, & 4
with the other strings.

Add the center strings back to
the group of strings and tie a
knot (step 4).



Macramé: Tiny Knot is a sweet MUST have bracelet. You'll want a wrist full of these! ✨



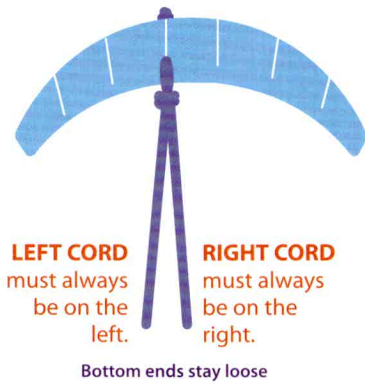
You will need:

1 waxy cord 40" (approx. 102cm)

Starting knot:

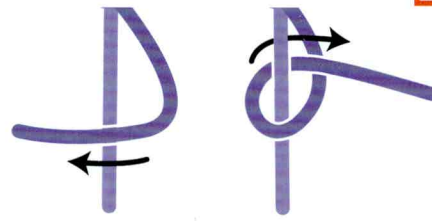
Fold over knot.
You now have 2 cords.

Set up



1 Single backward knot

Hold the left cord **straight**.
Make a backward knot with the right cord.



IMPORTANT
Keep the left cord on the left and the right cord on the right. If you don't, the knot will twist.

2 Single forward knot

Hold the left cord straight.
Make a forward knot with the right cord.



Macramé: Dots & Dashes Love this one! Works best with the waxy cords. ✨



You will need

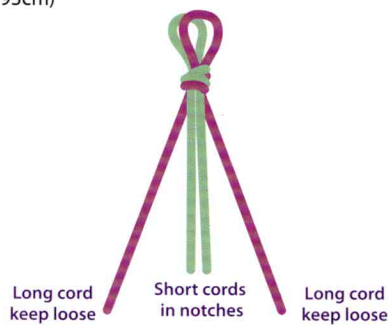
1 waxy cord 50" (approx. 127cm)
1 waxy cord 76" (approx. 193cm)

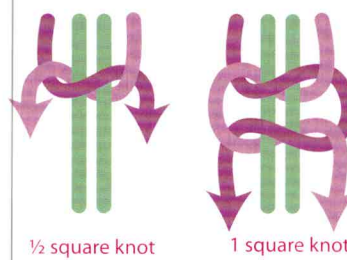

How To Make a Square Knot



1 Make 4 Square Knots with the long cords.



Macramé: Square Knot with Beads Fun to make. Use the bead threader. ✨

SPIRAL WEAVE

Get Started

Spiral Weave bracelets are based on a traditional Japanese technique of braiding strings or cords using a loom (like in this kit) to create beautiful jewelry.

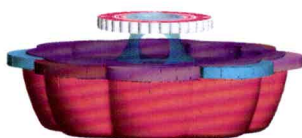

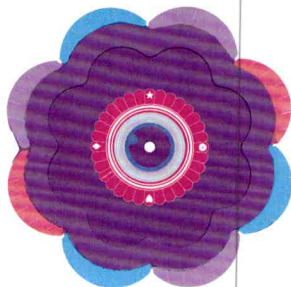
The Basics

You need to know this before starting.

Allow enough time. Each bracelet may take 1 hour or more to make.

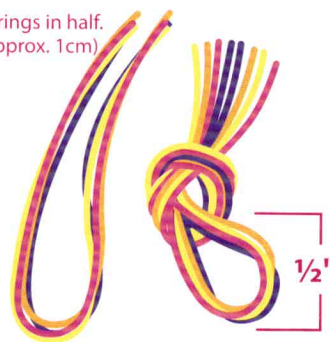

Make sure the foam loom is in place.



Fold Over Knot

Fold the strings in half. Tie a 1/2" (approx. 1cm) loop.

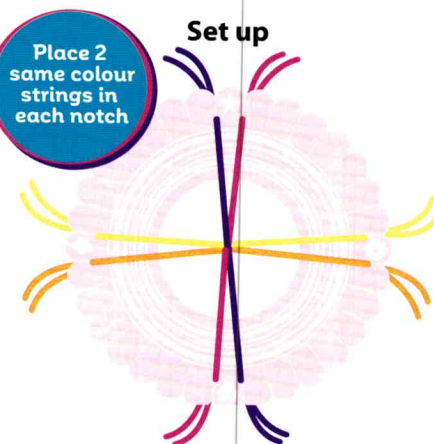

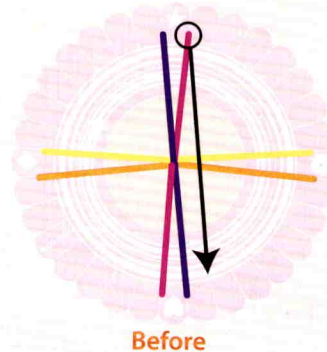

Silky cord bracelet

You will need:
4 pieces thick Silky Cord 50" (approx. 127cm) each
Make a fold over knot
You now have 8 cords.



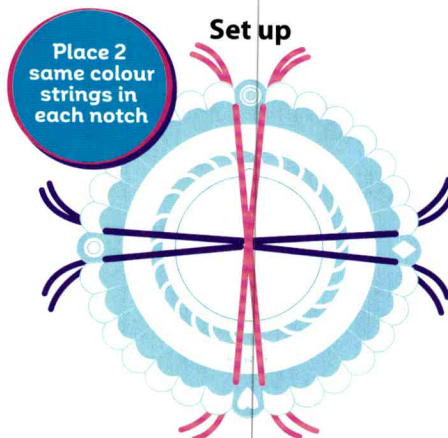

1. Remove adhesive backed round grips from square foam
2. Stick each as shown on flat area on bottom of Bracelet Studio
3. Turn over and push down so suction cup makes contact with a flat surface
*Please note non-textured surfaces allows better adhesion of suction cup, examples : glass, painted shiny surfaces or Formica countertop or table
4. Continue assembling the unit as per the instruction included.
